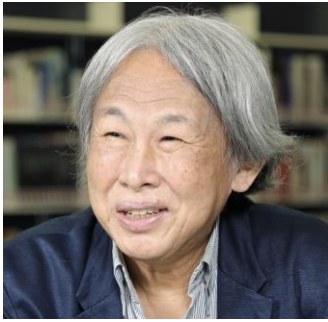

In the development of many IT systems, only functional quality is pursued, and quality of usability is not paid attention enough. In this presentation, Mr. Kawabata will discuss;

- 1) Usability quality as a basis of CX/UX,
- 2) 'Human-Centered Design' (ISO 9241-210) as a concept for user-centered development
- 3) A necessity for IT architects and CX/UX designers to work as a team in the upstream planning and design phases in order to achieve an IT system that combines high levels of both functionality and usability quality.

How the BTABoK Will Transform Your Architecture Practices

The goal of any architect or architecture team is to deliver value to their business and/or customer. The Business Technology Architecture BoK (BTABoK) represents a major leap forward in actual tools and techniques to make this possible, while at the same time developing a more mature architecture practice.
